

Joining Instructions: Blended - Course in Oil Spill Response Command and Control (IMO III Equivalent) - 2022

Welcome to your BLENDED Course in Oil Spill Response Command & Control (IMO III equivalent).

The following information includes detail on how to complete Part 1 of your course via our online learning portal and participate in Part 2 face-to-face at our Fremantle training facility.

Introduction

The Course in Oil Spill Response Command & Control has been designed to meet the needs of member companies who have identified senior staff members as potential incident controllers of oil spill response incident management teams.

The course provides a practical and theoretical grounding in key oil spill response incident management techniques and applies these learnings through intensive functional desktop exercises that simulate an incident management team environment.

Audience	Senior industry or government personnel who may be required to fulfil the role of an Incident Controller for marine oil spill response. Experienced emergency managers from other disciplines; aspiring incident controllers with strong oil industry or oil spill response knowledge.		
Aim	To train and qualify personnel for potential appointment as Oil Spill Incident Controllers.		
Objectives	 Work within relevant legislation and guiding frameworks including OHS, the intergovernmental agreement and relevant contingency plans. Identify characteristics of and assess oil spills, implement appropriate initial actions and identify and make appropriate notifications. Implement appropriate initial actions and identify and make appropriate notifications in the case of an oil spill. Apply knowledge of a set range of oil spill response strategies to identify appropriate response. Apply knowledge to identify appropriate oil spill response equipment. Record, communicate and distribute oil incident response information within the structured environment of an incident control centre. Develop appropriate oil spill response strategies taking account of social-economic, environmental and insurance considerations. Lead a multi-agency oil spill management team to develop and implement ongoing response Monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of oil spill response strategies and implement alternate strategies if necessary.

Course Structure	Your BLENDED course will be delivered in two parts;			
Part 1	Self-paced eLearning (approx. 8-10hrs) through our Learning Management System – modules cover the fundamentals of oil spill response and a virtual warehouse tour.			
Part 2	Classroom (2x face-to-face days)			
	Day 1; Theory/Practical - Oil spill response critical areas which includes oiled wildlife response, waste management, media and communications, liabilities claims and compensation, developing and incident action plan, health and safety.			
	Day 2; Scenario simulations - real-time oil spill response simulations, utilising an Oil Pollution Emergency Plan. Focuses on initial actions, gaining and maintaining situational awareness, selecting appropriate spill response strategies and supporting equipment, as well as consideration of health and safety, communications and waste management.			
Assessment	Your BLENDED course is competency-based and includes assessment throughout each of the elements outlined above.
